**Easter Joy** The Psalm for Easter Sunday says, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."

Above all days, Easter is a day of joy.

But what is joy? The answer St. Francis gave to this question is famous. St. Francis said to his Brother Leo, "When we come to St. Mary of the Angels [our house], soaked by the rain and frozen by the cold, all soiled with mud and suffering from hunger, and we ring at the gate of the place and the brother porter comes and says angrily: 'Who are you?' And we say: 'We are two of your brothers.' And ... he does not open for us, but makes us stand outside in the snow and rain, cold and hungry, until night falls—then if we endure all those insults and cruel rebuffs patiently, ... oh, Brother Leo, ... perfect joy is there!"\*

Whatever we may think of St. Francis's explanation of perfect joy, Easter reminds us that Francis's kind of joy is not the end of the story. At Easter, we celebrate the other kind of joy, the kind each of us longs for, when every tear is wiped away, and there is no sorrow anymore—no more suffering from weather or hunger or hurtful human beings. As we sing in the much-loved hymn by Fr. John Foley, SJ, at Easter there is only "the cross and passion past; dark night is done, bright morning come at last!"\*\* When we ourselves rise to meet our risen Lord, in that bright morning we will hear the Lord say, "Come away, beloved. The winter is past; the rain is gone, and the flowers return to the earth" (Song of Songs 2:10-12). In the loving union of that encounter, all the heartbrokenness of our lives will be redeemed. That will be perfect joy.

If all we had was the joy St. Francis describes, our courage might fail us in this life. Easter celebrates now the perfect joy waiting for us when we and all creation are reborn with our resurrected Lord into the everlasting love of God. This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.



# EASTER BLESSINGS OF RISEN LORD ON ALL

## **Easter Sunday**

Acts 10:34,37-43; Psalm 118; Colossians 3:1-4; Luke 24:1-12

Today we hear stories of the Resurrection from Acts and from the Gospel of Luke. Both are told not only so that we will believe that Jesus has been raised and is living but, even more, that he is the one sent by God who can forgive all our sins. If our sins are forgiven in Jesus, what can keep us from our Christian goal of life in full union with God?

People were first urged to believe because they were told by eyewitnesses to the empty tomb and the appearances of the risen Jesus. These were experienced facts, demonstrating beyond a doubt that Jesus was alive. We strengthen our own belief by pondering these reports again now.

Paul gives us our next step. We respond to our belief in Jesus by fastening our intention on things above rather than on things of earth. If we believe deeply in the Resurrection, we will understand that we have died with Jesus, that the world can no longer hold us. Therefore, we can focus our whole life on our risen Lord and his life within us.

Choose one area of your life in which you are intent on things of earth. Invent a way to turn that into its opposite: focus on Christ. Make it your heart's offering to God.

#### **QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION**

Should we witness with more than words? Peter bore witness in a different manner after the Resurrection than he did before Christ died. To what do you attribute this? Was he consumed by love for Christ and his Gospel? Could the source of strength for Peter be the same source for us?

"Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above." (See later in Colossians 3 for Paul's meaning of "above"). He says that we should put on heartfelt compassion. What does compassion look like in our immediate world and in the larger one? What is it that allowed John to "see and believe," to have this kind of clarity? Does love give you knowledge about a person, or insights into their behavior? In John, Jesus said "Whoever loves me ... I will love him (her) and reveal myself to him (her)" (Jn 14:21). Is there a connection between Jesus' statement and John's "seeing and believing"?
