**Believe and Be Saved** The first line in the Gospel reading is powerful: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." God's love for us is so great that he has found a way to bring us from death into life in himself.

And what is that way? Well, as the Gospel says, you must believe in the only Son of God.

You are saved from death by believing in the Son of God.

But what is it to believe in the Son of God? Believing in a person is not the same as believing that a claim is true, is it? To believe in a person is to trust that person for some things.

So to believe in the only Son of God is to trust him.

Trust him for what? Well, trust him to bring us from death into life. That is what the Gospel says, isn't it? God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

So here is God's funny system. You are saved from death by believing in the Son of God, and you believe in him if you are willing to believe that he saves you from death. Your contribution to your salvation is to believe that God will save you.

Of course, it is important not to get mixed up here. Your contributionis not the self-congratulatory belief that you are saved, or the even funnier but equally self-flattering belief that you have belief in the Son of God. No, your contribution is really just to believe in the Son of God.

Think of it this way. If I say that I believe you are my only way of getting out of this burning building alive and then settle down to watch TV, what I say isn't true, is it? What I say turns out to be true only if I am glued on you, totally focused on following you out of that burning building. If I really believe you can save me from the building burning around me, I will certainly cleave to you now.

How much more should we cleave to the Savior when we believe in him and trust him to bring us from death into life?



**REOPENING CHURCH FOR MASS** With the approval of the diocese, the new directives allowing up to 25% of capacity of church will allow participation in Mass beginning this Sunday. Saturday evening mass will be delayed until sufficient volunteers are available. Because of the difficulty with disinfecting worship books, they have been stored and a disposable order of service will be provided for mass. Please cooperate with direction of ushers for the sake of confidence and safety of most vulnerable.

Steve Pobst and Zach Garrett have agreed to be co-leaders who will coordinate training and scheduling of the required volunteers. Three captains will oversee the workers for a) Set-up of church, b) Ushering people in and out of the service and assuring that social distancing, masks and hand cleaning are observed, and c) clean-up – disinfecting all surfaces of church used during service. Jared Bergmann has agreed to be captain of set-up. We are seeking helpers for ushering and clean-up (guidelines request those over 65 and other covid-vulnerable individuals not be enlisted as volunteers). The dispensation from Sunday mass will continue to be offered. Also the recorded Mass will continue to be available for those who do not get out to church.

In 1990, Fr Dan Friedman organized a Parish Council at St Francis DeSales. Previously the pastor with advisement of trustees made most decisions about temporalities.

# **Trinity Sunday**

Exodus 34:4-6,8-9; Daniel 3:52-56; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18

Giving is the Trinity's way. This weekend we celebrate the Christian mystery that God is one yet three. This truth easily can become only a head trip, a reality that we admire but don't imitate. The dangerous consequence is that the Trinity becomes a phrase in the Creed rather than a way of life. Today's readings offer a compelling view of the Trinity as the pattern for living.

The Exodus scene captures the renewal of Israel's covenant with God after the people had sinned in the golden calf incident. Moses speaks of the Lord as "a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness" (vs. 6). The Israelites have been unfaithful, yet Moses prevails upon God to be faithful. Yahweh is loyal and this forgiveness demonstrates the giving nature of the Trinity.

Paul pleads with a divided community at Corinth to make mutual peace a reality and hence to experience God in their midst. In this particular blessing, Paul includes not only Jesus but also the Spirit and hence asks the community to appropriate the Trinity's way of life: Jesus' self-giving in death, the Father's loving surrender of the Son, and the Spirit's creation of fellowship between Christ and Christian.

The gospel passage continues Jesus' dialogue with Nicodemus. Jesus points out that faith is necessary to benefit from the gift of the Spirit. The Father's sending of the Son brings salvation to the world. To accept the message of Jesus is to be caught up in the pattern of giving, sending, and loving.

In the face of hurt and betrayal, the modern Christian is asked to reflect on a God who reaches out and forgives. We too must create peace in the face of factionalism. Rather than selfishness we must demonstrate giving, sending, and loving. These are real life attempts to live our belief in the Trinity. "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" is the legacy and responsibility of every Christian. -- John Craghan, Th.D., S.S.L.
