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A Heart So Great

Mary, by uniting herself to God, does not distance herself from us. She does not go into an unknown galaxy, but whoever approaches God comes closer, for God is close to us all; and Mary, united to God, shares in the presence of God, is so close to us, to each one of us.

There is a beautiful passage from St. Gregory the Great on St. Benedict that we can apply to Mary, too. St. Gregory the Great says that the heart of St. Benedict expanded so much that all creation could enter it. This is even truer of Mary: Mary, totally united to God, has a heart so big that all creation can enter this heart...she has a heart as great as the heart of God.

But there is also another aspect. In God, not only is there room for humankind; in humankind there is room for God. This too, we see in Mary, the Holy Ark who bears the presence of God. In us there is space for God, and this presence of God in us is so important for bringing light to the world with all its sadness, with all its problems.

What is there to say then? A great heart, the presence of God in the world, room for God within us and room for us in God...this is the symphony of this Feast, the instructions that mediating on this Solemnity gives us. Mary is the dawn and the spendor of the Church triumphant; She is the consolation and the hope of people still on the journey.---- taken from Pope Benedict XVI, Homily, August 15, 202

Mary, the Mother of God

In his moving musical composition <u>Like Winter Waiting</u>, John Foley, S.J., has Joseph sing about Mary, "Who is this woman?" For many people (and, of course, maybe for Joseph too) the question is really, "Who is this woman *to me*?" These two questions are very different in character.

Consider the first one: who is this woman? The traditional answer to this question is that Mary is the Mother of God.

This answer can be hard to understand. All Christians agree that God is without beginning. It seems that a God without beginning *can't* be born. And so it seems that God can't have a mother either.

But Jesus is fully human and fully divine. As man, God can be born. And so, after all, God can have and did have a human mother.

The woman who was that mother is Mary.

And that is why if it is taken as the question Joseph sings in John Foley's music, "Who is this woman?," the answer to the question is this: Mary is the Mother of God.

But the more pressing question remains: "who is this woman *to me*?" The answer to this question depends on the life and love of each person who answers it, doesn't it?

Think about it this way. For every person who reads this website, John Foley is the Jesuit priest who is the editor of this website and the composer of very influential liturgical music. But the answer to the question, "who is John Foley *to me*?" depends on the person answering the question. *To me*, he is a dear friend. But that is because the history of my life includes care for him and commitment to him.

And this is how it is for each person and Mary too. What Mary is *to you* depends on you, on your own care for her and commitment to her.

But, you might think, how much care and commitment *should* I have for Mary? Isn't that a backwards way to think about relationship with any person, though, Mary included? Maybe this is a better way. Elizabeth said to Mary, "who am I that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Luke 1:43) Maybe what we should ask is, "what are we that the mother of our Lord should come to us?" What Mary is *to me*—or *to you*—depends on

how you answer Elizabeth's question. -- Eleonore Stump from SLU Sunday website
